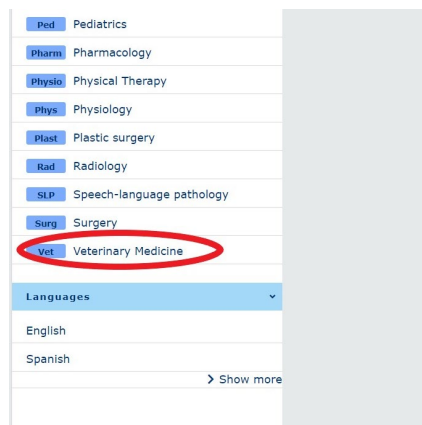
Translation

MedOne Veterinary Medicine ebooks are German language texts never before available in the English-speaking market that have been translated entirely with machine translation tools with no human editing. This means that you may encounter the occasional repeated word or phrase within the text. This also means that JPG images are not translated, meaning you may encounter some diagrams with German language labeling.

Navigation

Because MedOne is a platform that contains mostly human medicine focused content, you may need to navigate Veterinary Medicine differently from other MedOne products depending on whether your institution subscribes to other MedOne products.

Clicking the Home Page button will route you to the MedOne homepage which is encompassing of all our human medicine products in addition to VetMed. When navigating, remember to use the back button to return to the previous page in VetMed. If you do click the button that routes you to the MedOne home page, scroll to the bottom of the page and click the Veterinary Medicine link at the bottom of the menu on the left side of the page.

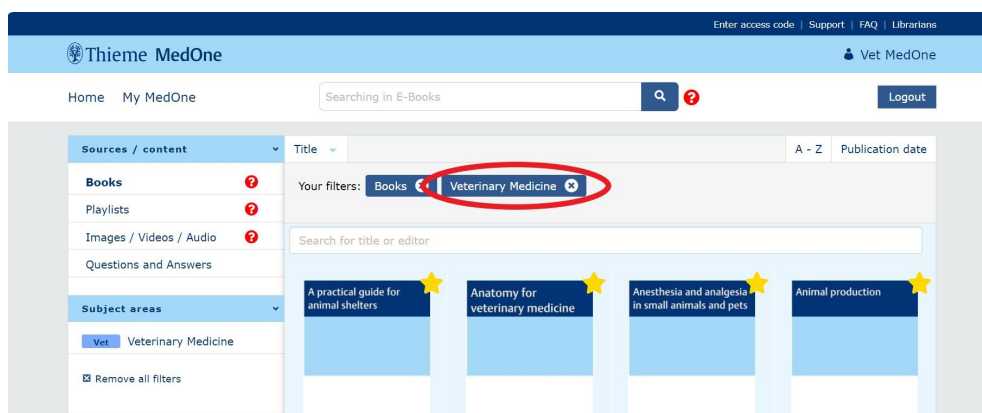


Citation

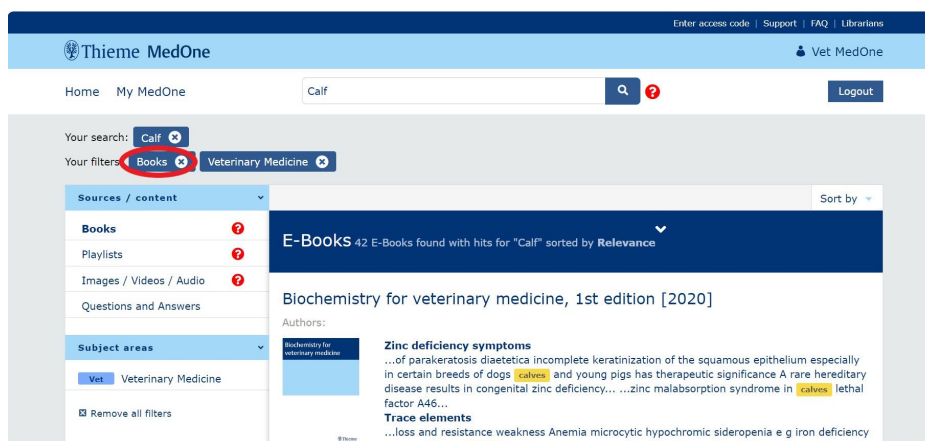
Search

When searching for materials, make sure the Veterinary Medicine tag is active. This ensures that all results will be from that collection.



You can search by entering the term you would like to use in the search bar at the top of the screen. It is important to ensure that the Veterinary Medicine tag is active so that all results are animal related. Let's try an example search in VetMed with the word "Calf".

If the "Books" tag is active, all results will be ebooks.



You can also search media from the images/videos/audio collection. To do this, remove the books tag and click “Images/Video/Audio” on the left side of the screen. Once the “Media” tag is active, your results will be from that collection.

PDFs of materials can be downloaded from VetMed. Clicking the PDF button will open a printing menu. Opt to print to Adobe PDF to download the PDF.

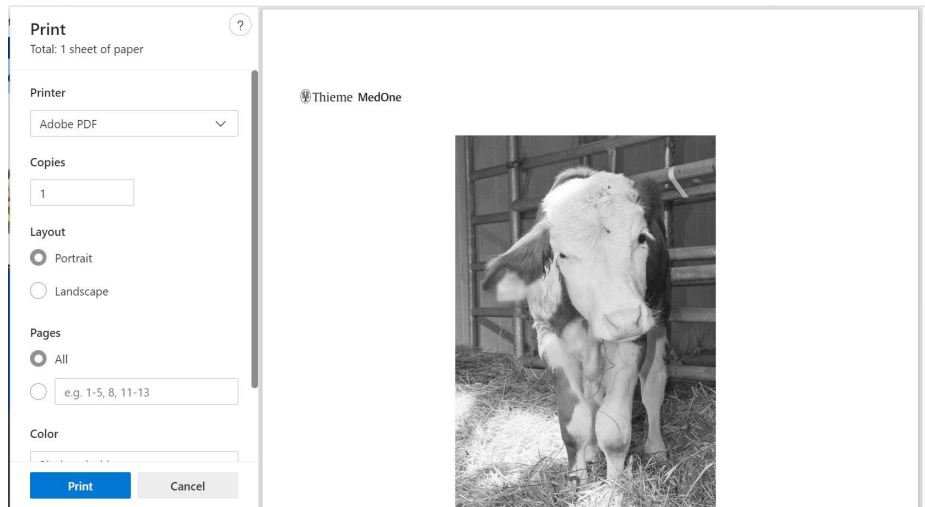

Possible causes of the pathological findings

The causes of a deviated posture (Fig. 4.6) are numerous. A head oblique posture may indicate, for example, vestibular syndrome, an elongated head and neck posture may indicate thrombophlebitis of the external jugular vein or inflammation of the retropharyngeal lymph nodes (druse), a curved back may indicate abdominal pain, see [Pathological Findings](#).

PDF + Playlist Share

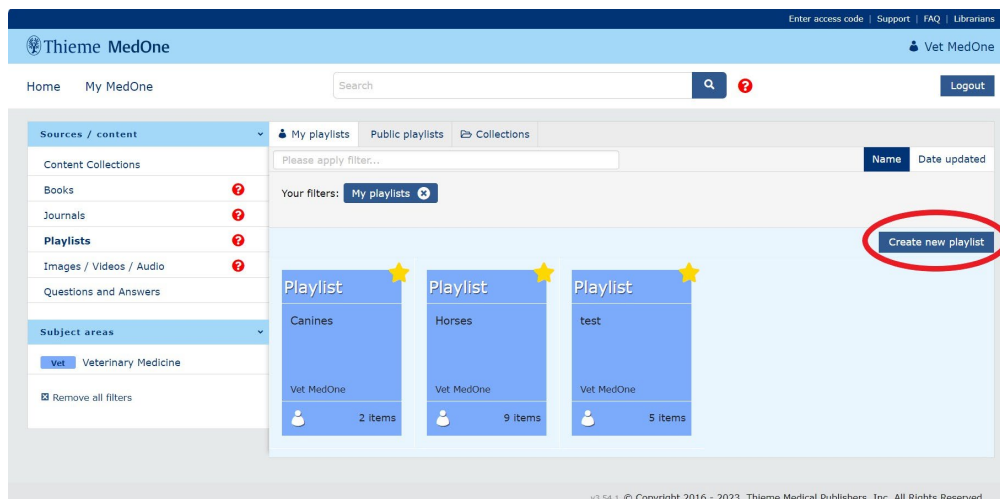


MedOne Veterinary Medicine has features that you will recognize from our other MedOne products. These features include playlists and PowerPoint downloads of images.

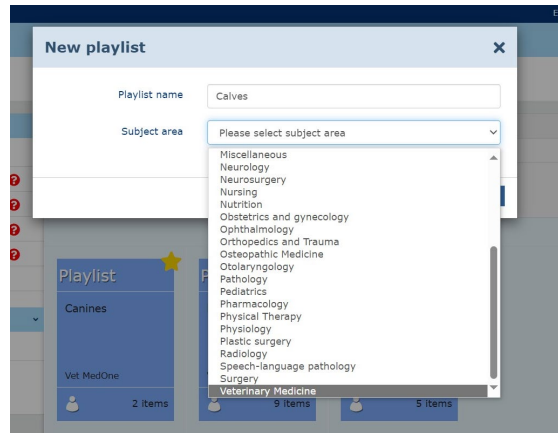
Please note that currently, Veterinary Medicine does not have a Q&A feature.

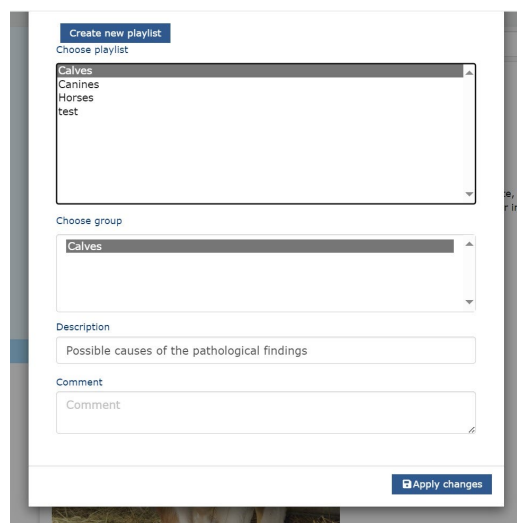
Select “Veterinary Medicine” from the dropdown menu. Name your playlist according to the topic you would like it focused on.



To add items to your playlist from the collection, navigate to the chapter or media you would like to add. Click the “playlist” button in the upper right corner of the screen.

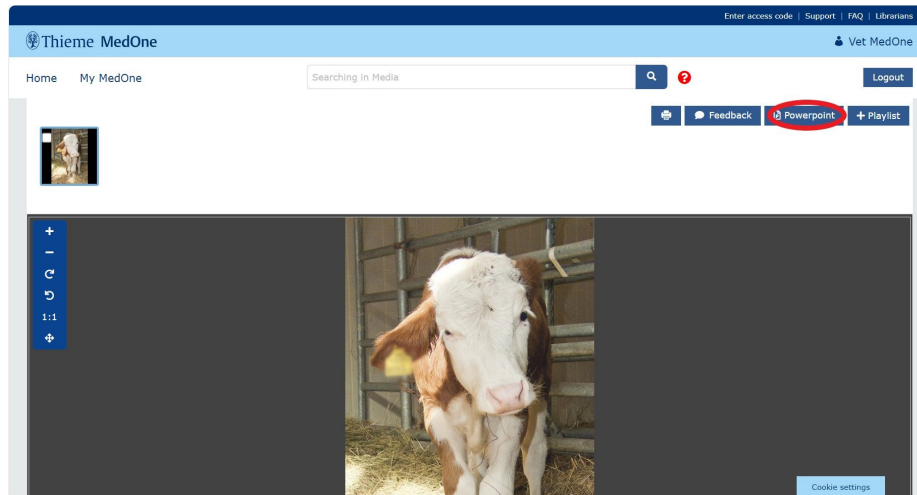


Select the playlist you would like to use from the menu. Add descriptions and comments as needed.

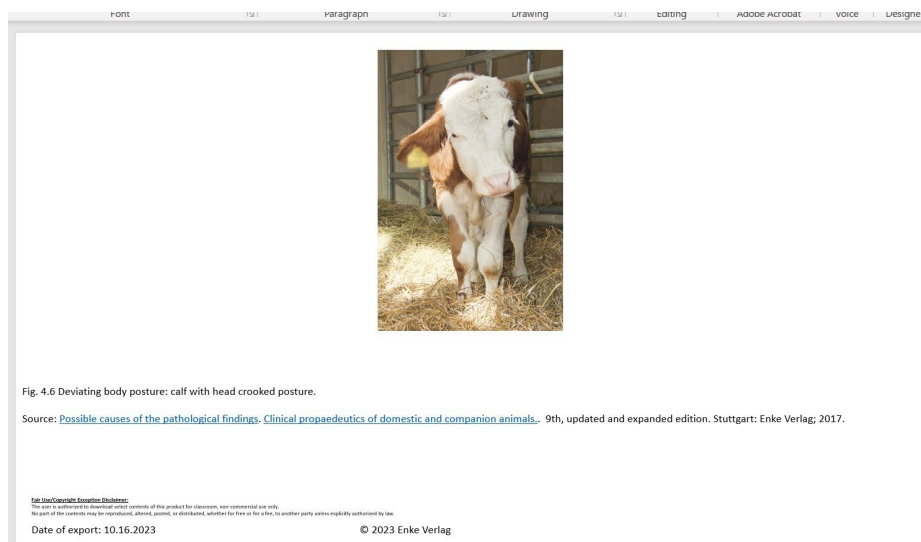


PowerPoint Downloads
